

## Red Wines

**Montepulciano d Abruzzo, 2004, Farnese, Abruzzi** 4.50 18

Tenuta Farnese, is housed in the medieval Castle Caldora in the picturesque town of Ortona. Originating in the 16th century, their vineyards, on the northern side of the Moro River, receive outstanding solar exposure, resulting in a wine that is full bodied, balanced and ready for your enjoyment

**Monte Antico Rosso, 2003, Tuscany** 6 24

Neil Empson and renowned oenologist Franco Bernabai orchestrate this predominantly Sangiovese wine from Tuscany's very finest vineyard sites. The best selections are blended and aged 1 year in oak and at least 6 months in the bottle, achieving a graceful balance of voluptuous berry tones, spice and lingering fruit flavors

**Monica di Sardegna Antigua, 2004, Santadi, Sardinia** 6.50 26

Founded in 1960 and closely watched over by cult winemaker Giacomo Tachis (of Sassacaia fame), this property claims 988 acres of prime, gently rolling vineyards reaching right out to the sea. Made from predominantly Monica grapes and 15% Carignano, this wine has an elegant bouquet, good structure and supple balance

**Nero d Avola, 2002, Santa Anastasia, Sicily** 7 28

Along Sicily's northern coastline, between the sea and the Apennine range, one finds the medieval abbey of Santa Anastasia. The estate's tireless proprietor, Francesco Lena, crafts wines of distinct character using ancient grape varieties like Nero d Avola

**Barbera d Alba, 2004, Ascheri, Piedmont** 7.50 30

Super enthusiastic and super friendly, the knowledgeable Matteo Ascheri is someone special. In addition to running his estate, Matteo oversees the local trattoria and a soon to open boutique hotel. His philosophy has always been to provide excellent value wines that reflect their region of origin

**Campofiorin Ripasso, 2002, Masi, Veneto** 7.75 31

Campofiorin is the original product of the personal interpretation by Masi's winemakers of an ancient vinification system used in Verona and technically known as double fermentation (using lightly dried whole grapes). Rich, full — bodied, round and velvety, this is a modern wine that is deeply rooted in tradition

**Chianti Colli Fiorentini, 2002, Lanciola, Tuscany** 8 32

This renaissance estate is owned by Carla and Giovanni Guarnieri. The family, complemented by one of Italy's greatest winemakers, Stefano Chioccoli, is producing wines of outstanding quality. The Chianti Colli Fiorentini exhibits lush, fruity and supple character — a wine that is very typical of and true to its origins

## White Wines

**Pinot Grigio, 2005, Di Lenardo, Friuli** 5.25 21

The affable Max Di Lenardo manages, along with his family, the entire production of this small yet stellar winery. The grapes for this Pinot Grigio were hand harvested, yielding a dry wine with complex aromas of straw and toasted almonds

**Pinot Bianco, 2004, Alois Lageder, Alto Adige** 6 24

Alois Lageder is a pioneer and visionary whose holistic approach and fidelity to nature, combined with long-term thinking, all come alive in authentic wines of the region. An avid practitioner of sustainable agriculture and respect for nature, Lageder produces wines of unique distinction and greatness

**Vernaccia di San Gimignano, 2004, Terruzzi & Puthod, Tuscany** 7.50 30

Perched on a hill overlooking the Val d Elsa, San Gimignano's intricate lacework of ancient white stone is set against a fairy-tale backdrop of deep green valleys and mountains, seemingly plucked from a Renaissance fresco. Its indigenous Vernaccia grape is said to be one of Italy's oldest; possibly going back to the third century B.C.

**Falanghina Sannio, 2004, Mastroberardino, Campania** 8.50 34

Long recognized as one of the most important and finest wine producers from southern Italy, the Mastroberardino family has been making wine in Campania since the early 1700s. Antonio Mastroberardino is acknowledged as one of the grand masters of Italian winemaking today. The wine is pale straw in color, very fresh and fruity

**Soave Classico, 2004, Pieropan, Veneto** 9 36

A few miles east of Verona, enclosed by the original town walls and dominated by its medieval fortress, the ancient commune of Soave has a peaceful, timeless quality about it. In the heart of the old town is the home of the Pieropans, the historical Palazzo Pullici, built in 1460 and purchased by Leonildo Pieropan in 1890 when he founded the Pieropan estate

## White Zinfandel

**Sycamore Lane** 5.25 21

After harvesting, the grapes are immediately pressed and the free run juice is cold-fermented in Stainless Steel tanks for 10 days at approximately 55 degrees Fahrenheit. The wine spends no time in oak and is bottled shortly after the first of the new year to preserve the fresh fruity qualities
